Just because a workshop, training program or book is listed in the newsletter does not guarantee quality. Having a certain academic degree does not automatically make one ethical or competent. And certainly, having studied with Dr. Erickson is, in itself, no guarantee of quality. So, be intelligent consumers.

We are proud to announce the opening of the Milton H. Erickson Foundation's new offices, located at 3606 N. 24th Street, Phoenix, Arizona 85016. Our new phone number is (602) 956-6196.

The Foundation is centrally located and easily accessible from the airport by taxi or bus. There are good hotel accommodations and restaurants within walking distance of the Foundation. Our offices are easily accessible to people with handicaps.

The new office contains five small rooms plus a reception/secretarial area. Two of the offices are being used for administrative purposes. One room will house our audio/videotape library, and will be used as a viewing room for professionals who wish to study independently at the Foundation. Remodeling is currently being done to provide us with a therapy suite and observation room for live supervision.

Our new location allows the development of many high quality educational programs on Ericksonian Psychotherapy and Hypnosis. Projects which were previously impossible because of space limitations, can now be developed.

We are extremely grateful to Shirley Bliss of the United States Foreign Service in West Germany for her generous cash donation. Her donation was a tremendous aid to us in getting the new offices established quickly, and was used to purchase furniture, desks, file cabinets, and to pay for remodeling costs.

### MEDIA OF INTEREST

Steve and Carol Lankton have signed a contract with Brunner/Mazel for their new book, Utilization and Indirect Suggestion: A Model of the Ericksonian Approach to Psychotherapy.

Dr. Erickson's first book, **Practical Applications of Medical and Dental Hypnosis** (co-authored with S. Hershman and I.I. Secter) has been reissued in a paperback edition for \$13.95 and is available by mail through Brunner/Mazel.

The February, 1982 issue of Psychology Today featured an excerpt from **My Voice Will Go With You:** The Teaching Tales of Milton H. Erickson to be published by W.W. Norton in April. The book was compiled by Sid Rosen, M.D. and includes stories and anecdotes that Dr. Erickson used in teaching therapists and clients. Lynn Hoffman of the Ackerman Institute contributed a foreword and the book has received advanced praise from Jay Haley, Ernest Rossi and Elie Wiesel. It will be offered as an alternate selection (June) by the Behavioral Science Book Service and the Social Science Book Club has chosen it as a Main Selection for May. Profits from the sale of the book will be divided with the estate of Milton Erickson, since Dr. Erickson was originally a coauthor of this book.

A tribute was recently written (in Japanese) called "Milton H. Erickson's Academic Work and Life". It was written by Dr. Noboru Takaishi, a psychiatrist at Osaka University in Japan. Dr. Takaishi visited the Ericksons some years ago.

Martin Reiser, Ed.D. and Capt. Michael Nielsen, M.S. were awarded the Milton H. Erickson Award, First prize, from the **American Journal of Clinical Hypnosis** for excellence in scientific writing for their article on investigative hypnosis in the October, 1980 issue. Reiser's recent books, **Police Psychology-Collected Papers** and **Handbook of Investigative Hypnosis** are both published by Lehi Publishing Co., 303 Gretna Green Way, Los Angeles, CA 90049.

Ericksonian Approaches to Hypnosis and Psychotherapy (Jeffrey K. Zeig, Ed.) is available from Brunner/Mazel, Inc., 19 Union Square, New York, N.Y. The volume, priced at \$29.95 consists of 43 papers presented at the December 1980 Erickson Congress.

The Dutch translation of **A Teaching Seminar with Milton H. Erickson**, supervised by Richard Van Dyck, M.D., is nearly finished. Additionally, contracts have been signed to have the book translated into Italian and German. Negotiations have begun for a Japanese translation.

#### NOTES FROM THE FOUNDATION:

I would like to inform you about some of the training programs of The Milton H. Erickson Foundation:

- 1. The Foundation is proud to sponsor training workshops led by experts in Ericksonian methods in Phoenix, Arizona. On April 2-4, 1982, we are sponsoring a workshop on "Ericksonian Diagnosis and Treatment", with Stephen and Carol Lankton. Our initial Phoenix workshop with Jay Haley and Cloe Madanes, held February 20-21, was an outstanding success.
- 2. We will continue to hold workshops in other cities. On June 26-27, 1982, I will conduct a workshop for the benefit of the Erickson Foundation in Los Angeles. (See advertisement in this issue.)

The International Congress will provide the opportunity for new faculty to present papers on advancing Ericksonian techniques. Additional information will appear in future issues of the newsletter.
- 5. We are establishing two training programs to be conducted in our new offices. The Erickson Archives are now available so that individuals or small groups can come to Phoenix to independently study audio-and videotapes that are housed at the Foundation. There is a nominal charge for use of the Archives. Please write if you are interested in details on this program. Additionally, this summer we will initiate a small pilot program consisting of live supervision in the Ericksonian method. Our new offices contain a therapy suite with an observation room.

We appreciate your interest in Ericksonian techniques and look forward to your participation in future training events.

## ERICKSON ANECDOTE "City Slicker"

I had the opportunity of spending a week with Dr. Erickson during the last week of July 1979. During the first 2 days, as we met in Erickson's little guest cottage, I found that I was puzzled and confused. I was not sure, a lot of the time, about what he was saying or what implication that he was trying to relate to hypnosis.

By Wednesday afternoon I was still confused and not even sure why I was there. Earlier in the week, Erickson had promised to show us his "magic genie." On the afternoon of the 3rd day, I asked him if he was going to show us his genie. He asked me if I believed in magic genies, to which I replied, "No." He stared at me for some time and then said, "I believe."

At the close of the session, he invited us into his home to see his genie. As I was the last one out of the guest house, I offered to wheel him into the back yard. The yard is enclosed with a wooden fence and gate. He instructed me to make sure that the gate latch was secure so that his dog could not get out. The latch was one that I had never seen before and I struggled to find a way to latch it securely.

Erickson sat calmly in his wheel chair, watching my struggle. When I thought that it was latched, Erickson reached over and gave the gate a push and it opened up. His eyes slowly moved from the gate latch, to my feet, and up to my eyes. And as his eyes met mine, he said, "City Slicker."

He secured the latch and I wheeled him into the house. I was hurt and still confused. And besides that, I wasn't a city slicker, I grew up in the country. We saw the magic genie, which, by the way, was a hologram of a woman blowing a kiss.

I was still confused as I sat in the guest cottage the next morning. In fact, I was beginning to get angry about his comment about the city slicker. Erickson began to spin another story. It did not have any particular significance to me. He finished the story with, "And that's what the 'City Slicker' does." I immediately looked up and found him staring at me for what seemed like an uncomfortably long time. Then it hit me. I was making everything hard. I was too intent on interpreting and analyzing everything that he said. Somehow, I believe that Erickson knew that I was confused and not comprehending the simplest of strategies when dealing with people. He was telling me, indirectly, that I was making it hard; slow down; look around you; there's so much more to see. I will never forget him or the 'City Slicker.'
